The fear of the Lord—a deep respect and awe for our holy God—is a theme that runs throughout Scripture. King Solomon admonished his son to fear the Lord in his series of wise sayings, the Proverbs. He said that if his son would turn his "ear to wisdom" and "search for it as for hidden treasure," then he'd "understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God" (Proverbs 2:2, 4-5). Along with wisdom and knowledge, he'd find discretion and understanding (vv. 10-11).

When we face challenges of many kinds and experience a sense of dread and fear, we're reminded of our limitations. But as we turn to God, asking Him to help us humble ourselves before Him and worship Him in reverence, we'll find He helps us to move from being fearful to embracing a healthy fear of Him.

Who Can Hear This? Perseverance or Perfidiousness (26 January 2025) John 6:60-71 (NASB95)

<u>Perfidity</u> - lack of faithfulness, treachery, an act or fact of violating the trust or confidence of another.
⁶⁰ Therefore <u>many</u> of His <u>disciples</u> , when they heard this said, "This is a difficult statement; <u>who can listen to it?"</u>
⁶¹ But Jesus, <u>conscious</u> that His disciples <u>grumbled</u> at this, said to them, "Does this cause you to stumble?
1 Chronicles 28:9 (NASB95) "As for you, my son Solomon, know the God of your father, and serve Him with a whole heart and a willing mind; for the LORD searches all hearts, and understands every intent of the thoughts. If you seek Him, He will let you find Him; but if you forsake Him, He will reject you forever.
Hebrews 4:12-13 (NASB95) For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. ¹³ And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do.
Question: When you grumble at what God says and he calls you on it, how do you respond? (Do you deny it and double down, or do you humble yourself and repent?)
62"What then if you see the Son of Man ascending to where He was before?"

Question: Things will be said and seen which affirm Jesus's claims. What will we do with them when we do not understand them? (At what point does the evidence one has suffice? Jesus is saying they have already received enough to believe but do not.)
⁶³ It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and are life.
1 Corinthians 2:12-14 (NASB95) Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God, ¹³ which things we also speak, not in words taught by human wisdom, but in those taught by the Spirit, combining spiritual thoughts with spiritual words. ¹⁴ But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised.
⁶⁴ "But there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the beginning who they were who did not believe, and who it was that would betray Him. ⁶⁵ And He was saying, "For this reason I have said to you, that no one can come to Me unless it has been granted him from the Father."
⁶⁶ As a result of this <u>many</u> of His <u>disciples</u> withdrew and were not walking with Him anymore.
⁶⁷ So Jesus said to the twelve, "You do not want to go away also, do you?"

2 Corinthians 12:9a (NASB95) And He has said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness."...

⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered Him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ "We have <u>believed</u> and <u>have come to know</u> that You are the Holy One of God."
To Jesus answered them, "Did I Myself not choose you, the twelve, and yet one of you is a devil?" To Now He meant Judas the son of Simon Iscariot, for he, one of the twelve, was going to betray Him.
